### **Why choose to study exercise science or athletic training at Texas Wesleyan?**

### **How valuable is a degree in exercise science or athletic training?**

An exercise science or athletic training major opens the door of employment as a coach, physical education teacher, aerobic dance instructor, athletic trainer, fitness director (of a health spa, hospital recreation center), athletic administrator, recreation therapist (in a hospital or rehabilitation center), or wellness director. ### **Diverse learning opportunities**

Several academic programs are offered within the department of kinesiology at Texas Wesleyan University. The exercise science major is designed to provide a foundation for students interested in fitness management or those preparing for graduate work in sport science. The athletic training/sports medicine major is a time intensive program which prepares students to work in the allied health profession of athletic training.

The recreation dive management (SCUBA) minor prepares students as PADI and SDI/TDI dive instructors. Optional summer internships in the Virgin Islands or West Indies provide experience in the operation of the scuba dive business.
