The history faculty at Wesleyan, with their professional and diverse backgrounds, brings a variety of expertise to the classroom. Classes average 25 students who are immersed in an environment where teaching and service are the most important components. Students learn from experts in the classroom and obtain first-hand knowledge from dedicated faculty, of whom 76% hold doctoral or terminal degrees in their field.
