Liberal Studies Major Opportunities at Texas Wesleyan University

Why choose to study Liberal Studies at Texas Wesleyan?

The faculty at Wesleyan, with their professional and diverse backgrounds, brings a variety of expertise to the classroom. Classes average 25 students who are immersed in an environment where teaching and service are the most important components. Students learn from experts in the classroom and obtain first-hand knowledge from dedicated faculty, all of whom hold doctoral or terminal degrees in their field.

How valuable is a major in Liberal Studies?

The purpose of the liberal studies program is to provide students with an understanding of several disciplinary perspectives, a greater appreciation of differences and similarities among disciplines, and the integration of diverse views. This major is appropriate for students whose career and personal goals require no specific major. Liberal Studies is particularly suited for **transfer students, those who have completed Wesleyan's Core Curriculum, and working professionals seeking to broaden their skills and enhance their promotability.** A Liberal studies degree prepares you for many types of careers. You gain the abilities to distribute and communicate information, to make judgments and decisions, understand and analyze difficult concepts, and to write and speak publicly with excellence.

Liberal Studies courses

Students majoring in Liberal Studies select from a wide variety of interesting courses. A Liberal Studies student will select one or two broad-based fields of inquiry (called clusters) for a total of 36 hours. If two clusters are selected, the student must take a minimum of 9 hours in each cluster. Thus, proportions of courses within two clusters could be as follows: 27 hours in one cluster and 9 hours in the second cluster or 24/12 or 21/15 or 18/18. There are four clusters to from which to choose. Cluster I focuses include *Fine Arts, Art, Music, Theatre Arts, Religion, Philosophy, Bible, History, 3PR—Pre-Professional, English and Languages.* Cluster II includes: *Business (Accounting, Economics, Finance, Management, Marketing, Business Administration, MIS) Cluster III includes: *Psychology, Political Science, Paralegal Studies, Sociology, Education*, and Cluster IV includes: Mathematics, Science, and Computer Science.
