Why choose to study political science at Texas Wesleyan?

Students at Texas Wesleyan have the opportunity to obtain a Bachelor of Science in political science or a Bachelor of Science in political science with a pre-law emphasis. For students considering law school, Texas Wesleyan offers the Pre-Professional Program, providing prospective law school students assistance in preparing for the LSAT exam and an opportunity to network and learn more about the legal profession. The political science faculty at Wesleyan, with their professional and diverse backgrounds, brings a variety of expertise to the classroom. Classes average 25 students who are immersed in an environment where teaching and service are the most important components. Students learn from experts in the classroom and obtain first-hand knowledge from dedicated faculty, of whom 76% hold doctoral or terminal degrees in their field.

Individuals with a degree in political science embrace a wide variety of opportunities for careers as anthropologists, campaign workers, chamber of commerce managers, diplomats, editors, educators, FBI/CIA agents, foreign service officers, geographers, judges, lobbyists, labor relations specialists, news reporters, political scientists, public health officials, public recreation directors, political consultants, politicians, research analysts and urban planners. Political science courses

Students majoring in political science select from a wide variety of interesting courses, including American Constitutional Law, American Government, European Governments, Foreign Policy of the United States, Fundamentals of Speech, History, Judicial Process, International Law, Logic, Political Theory, Scope and Methods of Political Science, and Statistics.

Students opting for the pre-law emphasis will engage in additional courses such as: Criminal Law and Justice, Development of British and American Democracy, International Relations, Judicial Process and Legislative Process.

All political science majors are given internship opportunities.
