## **Psychology Major Opportunities at Texas Wesleyan University**

### **Why choose to study psychology at Texas Wesleyan?**

The psychology faculty at Wesleyan, with their professional and diverse backgrounds, brings a variety of expertise to the classroom. Classes average 25 students who are immersed in an environment where teaching and service are the most important components. Students learn from experts in the classroom and obtain first-hand knowledge from dedicated psychology faculty, all of whom hold doctoral or terminal degrees in their field. ### **How valuable is a major in psychology?**

The purpose of the psychology program is to provide students with an understanding of the substantive fields and methodological issues of psychology as a science and a profession. Psychology majors can pursue a number of career alternatives following graduation and are encouraged to select a program of study to meet their individual needs. Those wanting to become professional psychologists should plan to attend graduate school to earn the appropriate advanced degree. Graduates with a bachelor's degree may work in various human service settings, such as in governmental, health, industrial, religious or youth organizations. Others may be employed in research related fields, such as advertising, human factors engineering or marketing.

### **Psychology courses**

Students majoring in psychology select from a wide variety of interesting courses, including Abnormal Psychology, Adolescent Development, Adult Development and Aging, Attitudes and Social Influence, Crisis Intervention, Death and Dying, Drugs, Alcohol and Human Behavior, Dynamics of Mental Health, Experimental and Research Methods, Foundations of Psychology, History and Systems of Psychology, Human Sexuality, Infant and Child Development, International and Cultural Psychology, Introduction to Counseling, Learning and Conditioning, Psychology of Cognition and Memory, Psychology of Personality, Social Psychology, Statistics, and Tests and Measurements. Certain courses and electives differ, depending upon the student's choice to pursue either a Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts in psychology.
