**Texas Wesleyan Intensive English students learn
about America through its favorite pastime**

FORT WORTH, March 28 – Texas Wesleyan University students from the Intensive English Program will attend Opening Day at the Ballpark in Arlington on April 4. The Texas Rangers will take on the Seattle Mariners in the first home game of the year. Students attending are from a variety of countries including Japan, Korea, Taiwan, Africa, Mexico, Chile, Indonesia, Vietnam, Bosnia, Saudi Arabia, Venezuela, Iran and China.

The purpose of the field trip is to help students learn about the culture of the United States and the Fort Worth area.
