**Texas Wesleyan University students present
President's Honors Concert, an eight-year musical tradition**

FORT WORTH, Jan. 16 – Texas Wesleyan University choral students and instrumentalists will present the President's Honors Concert on Monday, Feb. 16 at 8 p.m. in Nicholas Martin Hall located at 1201 Wesleyan inside the Ann Waggoner Annex Building. The concert is by invite only. A reception will follow the performance.

Having made its debut in 1996, the concert is an eight-year tradition for the University. The 90-minute President's Honors Concert will feature 10 Wesleyan music students who will perform mostly a classical repertoire. The concert allows performers the opportunity to meet Fort Worth arts patrons and VIPs, and it recognizes the University's continuous leadership in the arts within the community.

"We started this years ago to showcase the best talent of the department. Students audition to be part of the concert and then work with their teachers on the repertoire. The concert honors our president and showcases the students to the Fort Worth Community," says Tim Ishii, Texas Wesleyan associate professor of music and Chair of the Music Department.

Featured choral students are Eric Medlock, Sharon Milas, Jad Saxton, Krystal Vaughn and Alex Vorse. Featured instrumentalists are Mark Appling on guitar, Jozef Bobula on electric
