**Wesleyan offers new master's degree, tailor-made  
for the health-minded individual**

FORT WORTH, May 28 –This fall, the Texas Wesleyan University School of Business will offer a new degree: Master of Science in healthcare administration.

“The purpose of the new degree is to create a niche at the graduate level because of the major career growth in the health administration field in Tarrant County and in North Texas,” says Dr. Robert Minter, dean of the school of business administration and professional programs at Texas Wesleyan.

The new degree focuses on the integration of business and health administration and is geared toward working professionals already in the field. Instruction will be in the classroom at Texas Wesleyan and online learning will be through the A.T. Still University School of Healthcare Administration, in Kirksville, Missouri.

This degree will provide specializations in three areas: geriatrics, public health administration and health administration. Geriatrics focuses on long-term healthcare such as retirement or assisted living. Public health administration refers to publicly
