**Wesleyan Singers perform with Trouveres in fall concert**

FORT WORTH, Oct. 20 – The department of music at Texas Wesleyan University presents the Wesleyan Singers, under the direction of visiting assistant professor Mark Stamper, Oct. 26 at 7:30 p.m. in Nicholas Martin Hall inside the Ann Waggoner Fine Arts Building, located at 1309 Wesleyan St. The performance is free and open to the public.

Wesleyan President Harold G. Jeffcoat will give a welcome prior to the concert, and a recruitment table will be set up for those interested in studying music at Wesleyan.

Established in 1947, Wesleyan Singers is the university's principal performing choral ensemble. This will be the ensemble's first concert on campus for the 2004-05 academic year. The ensemble will sing Haydn's "Te Deum," "Lacrymosa" from Mozart's Requiem, Emma Lou Diemer's "O Come and Let Us Sing Unto the Lord" and other musical compositions.

Wesleyan's premier vocal ensemble, Trouveres, will join the program, performing "One World" by Mark Hayes; "At the Round Earth's Imagined Corners" by Williametta Spencer; "Ave Maria" arranged by David Conte; and Randall Stroope's, "The Cloths of Heaven."
