SENIOR ART STUDENT EXHIBITION RUNS NOV. 4-29

In her work with large-scale oil paintings on paper, Texas Wesleyan University senior Jill Foley emphasizes the journey of artistic creation, rather than a set theme or even the finished product. For Foley, “conceptual ideas are secondary to the actual process of creating.”

Foley, a bachelor of arts candidate, will present her senior project at the Fort Worth Community Arts Center. The exhibition, “What Secrets Look Like,” will be on display in the Café gallery from Nov. 4 through 29.

By applying paint with a palette knife, scratching away paint and then building a lush surface on the paper, Foley does not allow herself a great deal of control over what emerges. The beauty and excitement, for this artist, is what it becomes. Foley, who came to Texas Wesleyan from North Lake Community College, will be graduating in December.

The opening reception will be from 5 to 6:30 p.m. Friday, Nov. 4 at the gallery. The Fort Worth Community Arts Center is located at 1300 Gendy St. Viewing hours are 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday through Friday; 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday; closed Sunday.
