TEXAS WESLEYAN TO HOST 2005 GOOSTREE WOMEN'S SYMPOSIUM

The 2005 Faye C. Goostree Women's Symposium, with a theme of "Women: Wanting It All," will be held from 11 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Thursday, April 21, at Texas Wesleyan University. The keynote address will be in Nicholas Martin Hall, located in the Anne Waggoner Fine Arts Building, 1309 Wesleyan St. A luncheon will follow in the Betty and Bobby Bragan Fellowship Hall, located inside the Polytechnic United Methodist Church, 3229 E. Rosedale St.

Keynote speaker Amanda Lawrence, a sales representative with Schering Oncology, will explore the question, "Can a woman stretch herself so thin that she can do numerous jobs but none of them well?" The Symposium includes a luncheon, featuring poet JG Butts of Midland, a performance by junior theatre major Angela Brown; and a panel discussion led by women students. The keynote address is free and open to the public. Tickets for the luncheon are \$15 for general admission, \$12 for faculty and staff, and \$10 for students.
